



National Windrush Day | Windrush @75 Grant | Application Guidance 2023

Following the successful delivery of Windrush Grants for 2022, Race Council Cymru (led by Windrush Cymru Elders) has been invited by Welsh Government to manage the distribution of funds for National Windrush Day | Windrush @ 75 for 2023.

Below are some details to guide your application process:

National Windrush Day is a day that honours and celebrates the contributions of the 'Windrush Generation'; a name for people arriving in the UK between 1948 - 1971 from Caribbean and Commonwealth countries, who answered the call to help fill labour shortages and rebuild the UK after the second World War.

(The name 'Windrush' refers to the ship MV Empire Windrush, which docked in Tilbury on the 22 June 1948, bringing workers from Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago and other islands to the UK).

The 22 June 2023 will be the 6th National Windrush Day celebrated in Wales. 2023 is a highly significant year as we celebrate 75th Anniversary of the Windrush and the NHS and we look forward to reaching out widely to our communities across Wales, to invite you to apply for the grant.

Welsh Government has funded a number of events across Wales over the last 5 years and is keen to ensure that a diverse range of groups and organisations are able to access funding to provide events for their communities this year. This year, Race Council Cymru has been invited by Welsh Government to manage the distribution of funds for Windrush Day 2023 as we did in 2022.

Aims

The purpose of this funding is to enable delivery of events, activities and projects to educate and celebrate Windrush Day/ Windrush@75, 2023.

Objectives

- To provide funding to enable as wide a range of organisations and groups as possible to deliver activities, to celebrate Windrush Day 2023
- To provide funding to enable as wide a range of organisations and communities as possible to be engaged in activities, to celebrate Windrush Day 2023





Who can apply?

Race Council Cymru is seeking applications from constituted groups and organisations, who:

- Are based and working in Wales
- Can evidence capacity to plan, arrange and deliver events/ activities and projects and supply a post completion report with images, videos via WeTransfer audience evaluation etc.
- Can demonstrate engagement with their local communities, participants or audiences and involve Windrush Generation migrants and commonwealth nationals in their project.
- Can evidence their understanding of Windrush and how they will share key information.
- Can evidence their governance, safeguarding, inclusion and equalities policies are in in place and being adhered to.

Funding Guidelines

- Constituted groups and organisations can bid for funding between £100 £3,500 ideally. £5000 bids will be considered in exceptional circumstances for a single event. If you wish to host more than one event, or include workshops and educational materials, or bid for more than a celebratory one off event, you may prefer to submit a £5000 application.
- Funding is for revenue items only project staff, contractors, refreshments, materials, travel etc.
- NO capital spend is permitted

Funding Criteria

Applications must evidence how the event/ activity/ projects aligns with the Welsh Government Windrush guidelines of:

- Raising awareness of National Windrush Day | Windrush @75
- Promoting positive messages regarding Windrush Day
- Promoting the historical, economic and cultural contributions of the Windrush generation to Wales
- Providing education or training around Windrush generations and their contributions to Welsh Development.

In addition, each funded event, activity or project must credit Welsh Government (along with logos) as funder.

Process

- Applications will be assessed by an independent decision-making panel made up of Windrush Elders, commonwealth nationals and Race Council Cymru personnel. Welsh Government official will be invited to attend assessment of the grants applications.
- Online interviews may take place, should more information be required, in addition. to the information submitted on the application form.
- Award offer letter will be emailed to successful applicants.

Schedule of Funding

- Successful applicants will be awarded 50% of the funding on receipt of signed award offer and on submission of any further information and evidence required.
- The remainder 50% will be issued on assessment of final report / evaluation report at project end.

Reporting and evaluation

- The completion report template will be issued by Race Council Cymru to each funded organisation and must be completed by the deadline of 15th of September 2023.
- The completion report must evidence delivery, engagement and be supported by images and audience / participants evaluation and equalities data.

Contract Award Evaluation Criteria

The contract will be awarded to the most economically advantageous quote in terms of value for money on the basis of the following criteria, which are listed in order of importance including the weighting applicable to each criterion.

Please note your submitted quote should be inclusive of all envisaged costs in order to undertake the event, including Travel and Subsistence (T&S). Please see HMRC (www.gov.uk) guidance when calculating T&S costs.

Evaluation Criteria	Weighting
1.Quality	75
2.Cost	25
